In exercise of the powers conferred upon me vide Govt Order No. FST/20/1981 dated 1st February, 1981 issued by the Government of Jammu and Kashmir Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1978, I, Chaman Lal, I AS, Deputy Commissioner, Kathua hereby order and declare the below noted area as Sanctuaries and Reserves in Kathua district;

S.No./ Name of Sanctuaries/Reserves

The area has been named after, Jasrota fort (Now ruins) once citadel of mighty Chieftain;

Proclamation:- The wild life sanctuary is located on the right of river Ujh, towards the north of village Jasrota and situated about 70Kms, north west of winter capital Jammu.

Boundaries:- North- Village Gurah Surja, Mala Taloti, Tibba Fourlai, Mun, Guramwala;

South- Jasrota, Mala, Shani and Khumpur villages and Canal Ujh.

East- Ruins of Ladmoti Khud.
The proposed area covers an area of 1004 Kilometers.

Approach :- The proposed sanctuary is accessible by a link road of 3-5 Kms passing through village Rajbagh situated on Jammu-Patankot Highway.

The local habitation surrounding the area and falling in the vicinity indulge in collection of wood and take their live stock in the area for grazing.

Status:- The area was under the administrative and technical control of Forest Department till 1984-85 now being administered by the Deptt. of Wildlife protection.

Configuration:- The area is hilly and broken by large Khuds running from North to South.

Climate :- The climate is Sub tropical and experiences rains
Objections, if any with regard to proposed area and its coming under the above mentioned area will be received from the land owners/interested persons in the above area within a period of two months from the date of publication of this notification in Govt. Gazette. No Objection whatsoever will be entertained after the expiry of the above mentioned period.



The proposed area holds a distinction of harbouring rich and variety of pheasant besides, other migratory and resident birds.

Recommendations:-

The late Maharaja of Jammu and Kashmir identified the area as a Wildlife Reserve in view of sustaining a rich potential of Cheetal population. But after independence the population size of Cheetal and other associates dropped down due to indiscriminate habitat destruction, mass poaching and other biotic interferences. The area of interest still hold strava congregation of cheetal and other rare and threatened species. In order to protect the habitat and the Wildlife species therein, it is proposed that the area may be declared as a Wildlife Sanctuary under Section (17) of Jammu and Kashmir Wildlife (Protection) Act 1978.



LUTUS SURVEY REPORT OF THE PROPOSED JASROTA WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

Name of Nature :- The area has been named after, Jasrota fort (Now ruins) once citadel of mighty chieftain.

Location :- The Wildlife Sanctuary is located on the right bank of river Ujh, towards the mouth of village Jasrota and situated about 70 Kms. north-west of Winter capital, Jammu.

Neighbouring Villages :- North - villages Guram Surja, Mala teleti, Tibba, Furlein, Mum, Guram wala. South - Jasrota, Mala, Shani and Khum Pur villages and Cannal Ujh. East - fains of Ladmali Khad.

- 1. Proposed area covers an area of 1,004 acres.
- 2. The proposed Sanctuary is accessible by a link road of 3.5. Kms. passing through village Rajbagh situated on Jammu-Patankot National High Way.
- 3. The local habitation surrounding the area goes on fulfilling in the vicinity indulge in collection of fire wood and take their live stock in the area for grazing.

Legal Status :- The area was under the administrative and technical control of Forest Department till 1984-85, now being administered by the Department of Wildlife Protection.

Configuration :- The area is hilly and broken by large khuds running from north to south.

The climate is sub-tropical and experiences monsoon.

Vegetation :-

- 1. COMPOSITION AND CONDITION OF CROP :- The area sustains only the Bamboo plantation manifested by habitat, form and density of the dominant species and controlled by a number of factors including exposure, altitude and above all the biotic interferences, Bamboo plantation is associated by other broad-leaved species like Acacia catechu, Acacia arabica, Dalbergia sissoo, Magle mormelosa, Lannea grandis etc. The shrub layer is very rich dominated by Lantana camara, Carrica sinarum, Dodonaea viscosa, etc. and climbers such as Bauhinia Vahlii etc. come into composition.

Distribution of Bamboo cane by is richly met in the compartments 1,2 and 3 towards east of proposed Sanctuary, While other compartments i.e. 4,5, and 6 towards the west sustain concretion of wood cover.

Once the area was very rich in wide variety of fauna and due to excessive biotic interference like poaching, unlimited grazing, and afforestation few species are left which are stated as under:-

- 1/- Chital or spotted Deer (Axis axis)
- 2/- Barking Deer. (Muntiacus muntjak)
- 3/- Wild Boar. (Sus sciratus)
