

Trivia / Special Features: : Uses its hearing and smell more for survival. Has powerful jaws and claws. Can run at speed of upto 58 kmph. Melanistic leopards are called Black Panther.

Trivia / Special Features: : It is also called the moon bear due to the crescent-shaped white mark on its chest. Its black fur is much shorter than that of the other bear of India. Has puffy ears and a very short tail

Trivia / Special Features: Yellowish brown to dark grey shaggy coat. Male exhibit dense mane around neck and antlers. In case of threat, it can make short and high-pitched sounds. Communicate by scent marking and foot stamping.

Trivia / Special Features : Emus can jump to a height of up to 7 feet. When frightened, emus can run up to 80 kmph and jump and kick to defend themselves.

Trivia / Special Features: One of the smallest deer species. Males have short antlers and long canine teeth, called as tusks. On alarm call sounds like barking, hence called as barking deer.

Habitat: Rivers like Ganga, Brahmaputra and Mahanadi

Breeding: Incubation period: **60-90** days, Clutch size: **20-100** eggs

Trivia / Special Features: : Long protruding snout with 110 saw like teeth. Male has a bulb at the end of the snout, which resemble an earthen pot, called as 'ghara', hence the name Gharial.

Trivia / Special Features: Snout is wide and strong. Crocodiles have smooth skin on their bellies, while their dorsal surfaces are armoured with large osteoderms. Streamlined body enables it to swim swiftly.


