MINUTES OF 4th MEETING OF THE WILDLIIFE BOARD FOR UNION TERRITORY OF JAMMU & KASHMIR HELD UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF HON'BLE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF UT OF JAMMU AND KASHMIR ON 06-06-2023 AT CIVIL SECRETARIAT, SRINAGAR.

4th meeting of the Wildlife Board for Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir was held under the chairmanship of Shri Manoj Sinha, Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor, UT of Jammu & Kashmir (Chairman, Wildlife Board for UT of Jammu & Kashmir) on 06-06-2023 at Civil Secretariat, Srinagar. Shri Arun Kumar Mehta, IAS, Chief Secretary, Jammu & Kashmir (Vice Chairman of the Wildlife Board) was also present. The list of members of the Wildlife Board and the officers who attended the meeting is attached.

At the outset, Principal Secretary, Forest, Ecology & Environment Department welcomed the Chairman, the Vice Chairman, and all the Members and Officers who participated in person & online and briefed about significant works of Department of Wildlife Protection. He mentioned that all the cases cleared in the 3rd meeting of UT Board for Wildlife which required further clearance by Standing Committee of National Board for Wildlife, have been cleared in its 69th meeting.

Thereafter, a presentation was made by Chief Wildlife Warden, Jammu & Kashmir. He also presented the Action Taken Report before the Board with regard to decisions taken in the 3rd meeting of the Wildlife Board, followed by discussion on agenda items sequentially.

During the discussions, Dr. C.M. Seth expressed gratitude to Hon'ble Chairman for dedicating the Jambu Zoo to public. He appreciated the layout of Jambu Zoo and suggested establishing a Fossil Park adjoining Jambu Zoo. Shri Nazir Be Nazir lauded the efforts of the Department in restoration of wetlands and handling Human-Wildlife Conflict. He suggested for having Wildlife Rescue Teams at Block Level with adequate equipment and manpower. He also mentioned establishing City Forests/ Nagar Vans in various municipalities. Dr. Khursheed



Ahmad mentioned taking up of Conservation Breeding Centre at Tral in project mode, which has been operationalized recently.

During the meeting, Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor released Hangul Census Report 2023. While appreciating the work of the Department of Wildlife Protection, the Hon'ble Chairman and Vice Chairman also issued following directions;

- a) The awareness videos of the Department showing birds in the wetlands should have natural sounds of birds instead of recorded sound.
- b) Since visitors are allowed mostly in buffer zone of Dachigam National Park, the department should increase the number of permissions ensuring no detrimental affect on ecology.



c) To encourage trekking in Forest & Wildlife Areas, National and International organizations besides universities should be approached.

d) There will be zero tolerance to poaching/ hunting. Any violations in this regard should be dealt severely under Law.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
